CHALLENGES FACED

Working towards this goal for more than 2 years, we have noticed that research work is strenuous and fetching the student community to be motivated to write the research paper beyond post-graduation and dissertations have always been challenging



NEED

A good quality original research comes with a good meta-analysis, hypothesis, and literature review, and in our experience, this takes at least four to five months to be fully completed and applied in formal psychology education and therapy.

We currently have 12 mentored projects pending under the Young Researchers Program and are reaching out in the request of an appeal so that we can support a cause like this and keep the educational arena alive in the country at a high-level intervention of mental health counselling through the understanding and the filters of Neurolinguistics and Gestalt.

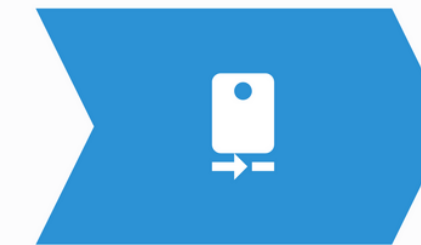

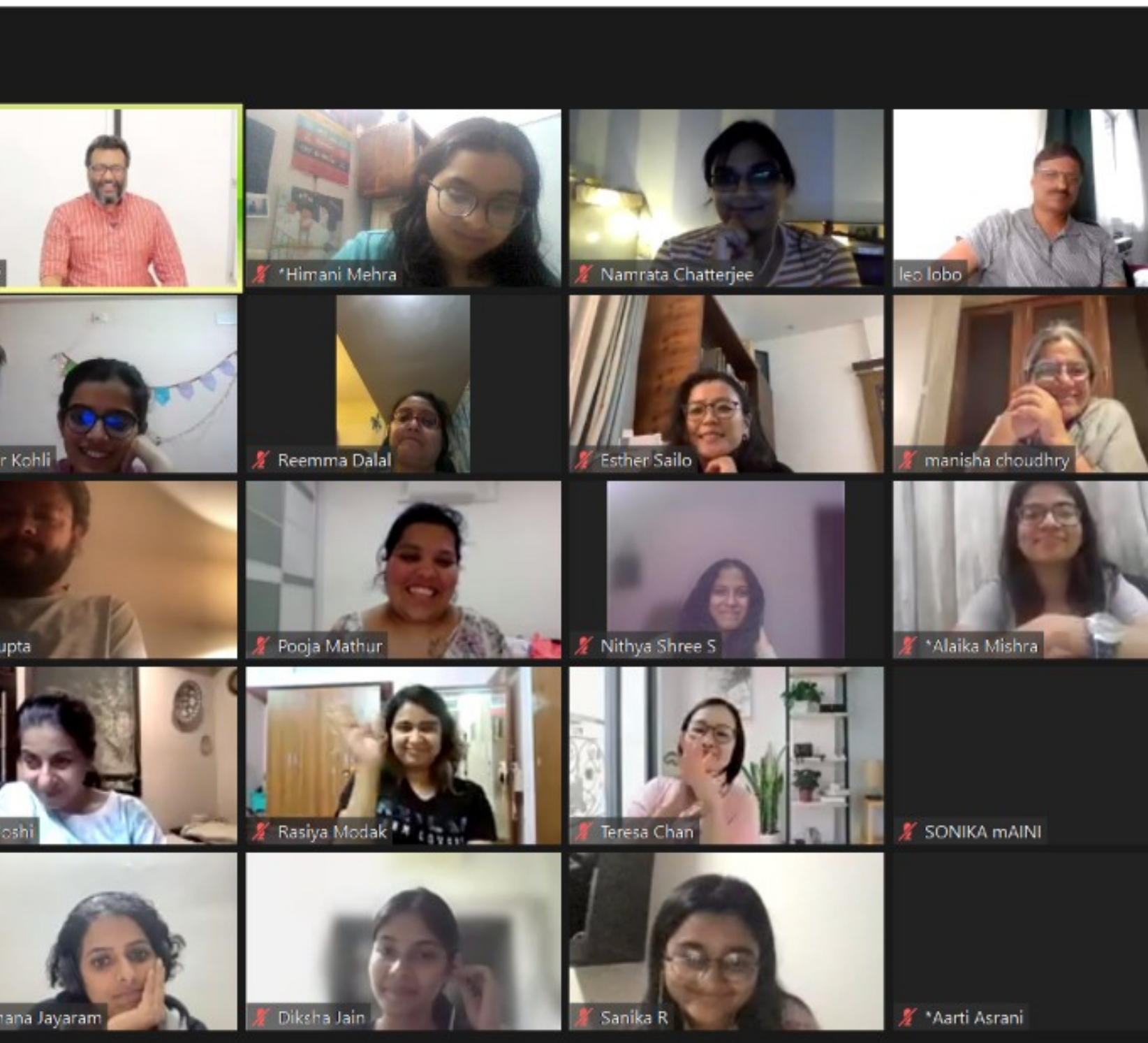
5 - Results and Discussion



An average research mentorship would be around five to six months which adds up to a financial resource of Rs 30,000 which includes

- 1) Stipend to the researcher
- 2) Access to avail resources such as access to notes, research papers, psychometric tools,
- 3) Software like SPSS, R, ANOVA etc

The year-wise growth of papers research output in India and the world from the year 2001 to 2020

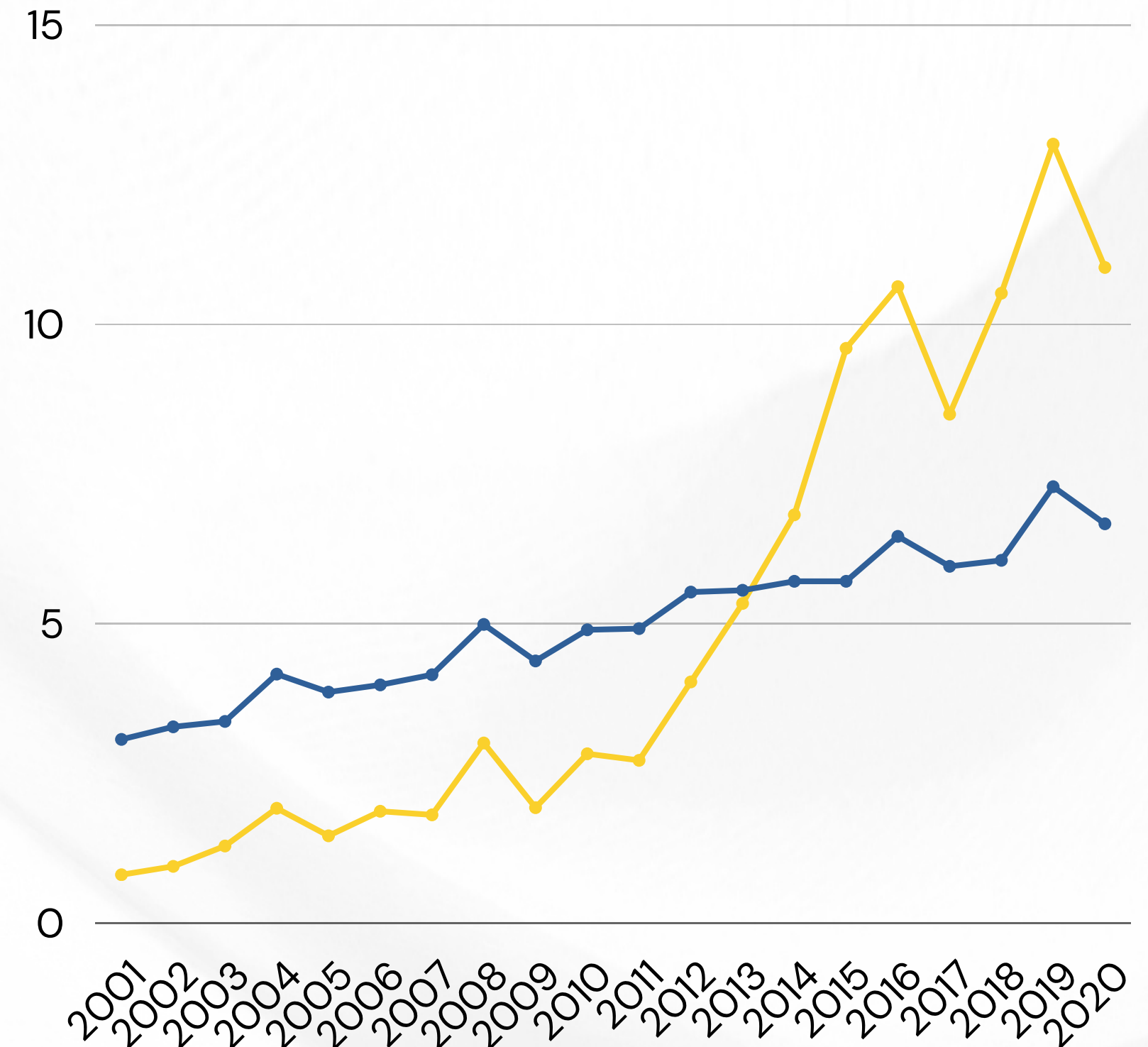
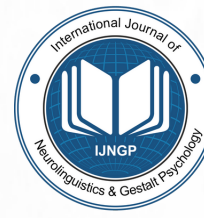
